SENATE BILL NO. 2077 (As Sent to Governor)

1 AN ACT TO CREATE THE "MISSISSIPPI HEALTHY FOOD AND FAMILIES 2 PROGRAM" WHICH REQUIRES THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND 3 COMMERCE, SUBJECT TO APPROPRIATION, TO FUND QUALIFIED MISSISSIPPI 4 NONPROFITS TO DISTRIBUTE FUNDS TO MISSISSIPPI FARMERS MARKETS AND 5 RETAILERS FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING MATCHING DOLLAR INCENTIVES 6 FOR SUPPLEMENTAL NUTRITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM BENEFITS SPENT ON 7 ELIGIBLE FRUITS AND VEGETABLES AT FARMERS MARKETS AND RETAILERS; 8 AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 10 SECTION 1. (1) This act shall be known and may be cited as

11 the "Mississippi Healthy Food and Families Program."

12 Subject to appropriation, the Mississippi Department of (2)

Agriculture and Commerce shall fund qualified nonprofit 13

14 organizations that shall distribute incentive dollars to

participating Mississippi farmers markets and retailers for 15

16 developing a nutrition incentive program to double the purchasing

17 power of Mississippi residents with limited access to fresh fruits

and vegetables, support farmers, and invest in Mississippi's local 18

19 economy.

20 The designated nonprofit organizations shall have a (3)

21 demonstrated track record of:

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(a) Building a statewide network;

(b) Implementing such funds for distribution andreporting processes;

25 (c) Providing training and technical assistance to 26 farmers markets, produce stands, and direct producer-to-consumer 27 venues;

28 (d) Conducting community outreach and data collection;29 and

30 (e) Providing full accounting and administration of31 funds distributed to farmers markets and retailers.

32 (4) At least ninety percent (90%) of the money deposited 33 into the Mississippi Healthy Food and Families Program shall be 34 distributed to participating Mississippi farmers markets, produce 35 stands, and retailers for healthy food incentives. A maximum of 36 ten percent (10%) of the money deposited into the Mississippi 37 Healthy Food and Families Program may be used for administrative 38 costs.

Guidelines and eligibility for the Mississippi Healthy 39 (5) 40 Food and Families Program shall be established by the Department 41 of Agriculture, consistent with the U.S. Agriculture Improvement 42 Act of 2018. For the purposes of this program, "eligible fruits 43 and vegetables" means any fresh or frozen, whole or cut fruits and vegetables that do not contain added sugar, fat, oil or salt. 44 "Eligible retailers" means a small business whose principal office 45 is located in Mississippi and that has a demonstrated commitment 46

47 to procuring Mississippi-grown foods, including fruits and

48 vegetables.

## 49 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 50 and after July 1, 2022.

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
