Five Ways You Can Take Action:

l. Prepare your statement.

Prepare to tell your congressional leaders 1) Who you are, 2) Why you care, 3) What you want. Sample language follows on the next page.

2 Write to your Senators.

Send an <u>Action Alert</u> through the Episcopal Public Policy Network to urge your Senators to take action now to support Dreamers.

3. Call your Senators.

Amplify your advocacy by calling in addition to writing. Congressional offices track outreach from their constituents on various issues. Every action you take adds to the swell of support for legislative action. Instructions follow on the next page.

4. Make a Donation to the DACA Renewal Fund.

Paying for the DACA and work permit renewal fee can be a barrier for DACA recipients to renew. Contribute to the United We Dream DACA Renewal fund.

5. Post to Social Media.

Sample language for your prepared statement

I write to you as an Episcopalian and a constituent to ask that you vote yes on legislation in support of Dreamers.

After termination of DACA in 2017, this vulnerable population is in danger of being deported and separated from their families and communities here in the U.S. Dreamers are an essential part of our schools, businesses, and faith communities. Failure to pass this legislation would result in devastating consequences for them and their U.S. citizen families or children.

My faith teaches that we should strive for justice for immigrants. As an Episcopalian I want my country to extend mercy to individuals in precarious situations who are critical members of our communities.

Therefore, I urge you to vote yes on legislation to establish permanent protection for Dreamers as the first step towards comprehensive immigration reform.

You will make two calls to be connected with the offices of your two Senators.

Call the U.S. Capitol Switchboard at (202) 224 - 3121 and ask to be connected to one of your Senators. Repeat this process for your other Senator, either conveying your message to a staffer or leaving a voicemail.
