Dear Commissioner Oriol,

I hope this correspondence finds you in great health and spirit. I write today regarding my ongoing concerns and our previous conversations as related to the sunken vessels in the Christiansted Harbor in the district of St. Croix. These boats, some of which were likely damaged and abandoned after the 2017 hurricanes, pose a serious safety hazard to other vessels and to seaplane operations. In fact, one of these vessels is located very near the seaplane dock in the direct path of the seaplanes.

I am truly concerned that these sunken vessels could cause a serious accident in our harbor, for which the Virgin Islands Government could ultimately be held responsible. As a matter of fact, earlier this month (circa Wednesday January 8, 2020) one of the seaplanes collided with one of those sunken vessels and caused flights to be cancelled, thereby shutting down the seaport. As I informed you in our previous conversations on this matter, I strongly suggest that it is time for your Enforcement Division to take full action in having those vessels removed and billing the registered owners (or their estates, if deceased).

Again, I am respectfully requesting that your agency take immediate steps to remove this debris before someone is seriously injured or it becomes a liability to the Government of the Virgin Islands. Kindly advise on what steps, if any, that have been taken thus far or what steps are planned to address this matter.
