Historically Speaking

Youngstown was founded in 1797 when John Young purchased 15,560 acres in the Mahoning River Valley from the United States Government through the Connecticut Land Company. By 1802, he and a survey company had laid out the Youngstown Township along the Mahoning River, seven miles west of the Pennsylvania state line. Youngstown, along with Warren, founded in 1798 and located 14 miles northwest are the principle cities of the Mahoning Valley.

This area was the first populated area of the Connecticut Western Reserve, and during the earliest part of the 20th century, immigrants from all over the world came to the

Youngstown area to start a new life. With that wave of immigrants came a wide variety of customs and traditions, and today, that rich heritage helps define the Mahoning Valley!

During the 20th century, the Mahoning Valley experienced rapid growth to due its central location and proximity to natural resources which allowed it to efficiently produce Steel. During this era, the Mahoning Valley became known globally as the Steel Valley! Historically, it was the largest steel producing region in the world. Despite the decline in steel production, the Mahoning Valley's investment in education and healthcare has allowed the area to sustain and remain one of the best places in Ohio to raise a family.

Where is the Mahoning Valley?

The Mahoning Valley is situated on the Mahoning River, approximately 65 miles southeast of Cleveland and 61 miles northwest of Pittsburgh. Youngstown is also the midway point between New York City (398 Miles) and Chicago (402 Miles) via Interstate 80.

Established in 1891, Mill Creek Park was the first park district in Ohio. The park extends from the City of Youngstown to various locations throughout Mahoning County and offers over 45 miles of trails over 4,500 acres and numerous activities. The suspension bridge, known locally as "Cinderella Bridge" is a popular location for family and wedding photography.

Founded in 1919, the Butler Institute was the first museum of American Art. The Institute's holdings now exceed 20,000 individual works, and the Butler is known worldwide as "America's Museum."

This multi-purpose public venue features everything from local bands and nationally-renown groups to concert performances and outdoor movie screenings.

Visit Boardman's Diletto Winery for award winning Meades, or head to Berlin Center's Mastropietro Winery, the Mahoning Valley's oldest winery.

Looking for more? 45 miles north near Geneva you'll find the Vines & Wines Trail, home to hundreds of acres of rolling, lush vineyards, award-winning wines like Pinot Gris, Riesling, Pinot Noir, Chardonnay and Cabernet Franc, easy to enjoy Chambourcin and Vidal Blanc as well as local favorites made from native grapes. The wineries of the Grand River Valley draw tens of thousands of visitors each year for touring and sampling.

Cuisine is Our Culture

Mahoning Valley restaurants are some of the best and most unique dining experiences you will find in Ohio. The area is loaded with local and cultural favorites, from Italian and Mexican to Middle Eastern and Greek, while offering every atmosphere you could ever need.















Where Do RP Rads Live?

Bang for your buck: There are few places more affordable than Youngstown, Warren & the Mahoning Valley.



On the east bank of Ohio's Second largest lake (Mosquito Lake) the quaint city of (1) Cortland boasts its ranking as the valley's safest city. Designated as a "Red Carnation" township selected for achievements in economic/community development, education, health and medical services and recreation opportunities (2) Howland Township has been an attractive option for families due to it's well-regarded schools. Best known as the home of Youngstown Country Club and its famed course designed by both Walter Travis & Donald Ross, (3) Liberty Township also boasts a wellregarded school system. At the intersection of I-80, I-680 and OH-11, (4) Austintown is certainly Mahoning Valley's most well-connected and convenient suburbs. Rated as one of the top 100 places to live by Money magazine, (5) Canfield is also home to Ohio's 2nd largest fair, "The Canfield Fair". Youngstown's largest southern suburb is also its retail hub. (6) Boardman is home to both the Southern Park Mall and The Shops at Boardman park. It's well-well-regarded school system is best

known for alumnus and Cleveland Browns legend, Bernie Kosar. Best known for its excellent school system that produced President William McKinley and a dominant basketball program, (7) Poland and its picturesque village center is one of the best places to reside in the Mahoning Valley.
