Re: Student Assistants Election Agreement with California State University Employees Union

As California State University (CSU) campuses gear up to welcome students this fall, we wish to underscore with great urgency the vital need to promptly address the process enabling CSU Student Assistants (SA) to formalize an election agreement with CSU Employees Union (CSUEU) for union representation. These approximately 15,000 dedicated SAs, who contribute significantly to the functioning of CSU campuses throughout our state, are taking the initiative to form a union in pursuit of better wages and improved working conditions. It is imperative that they have the opportunity to engage in a swift and equitable election process.

SAs often do the same kind of work as union staff members but don't receive the same pay and benefits because they're not officially represented by a union. Even though their work is vital for campus operations, student employees can't engage in collective bargaining like other CSU workers.

As a publicly funded institution of higher learning, with the unique capacity to pave the way for a diverse array of students, the Chancellor's Office has a prime opportunity to endorse our youthful workforce's singular request: to secure a place at the labor table and actively contribute to these important discussions.

SAs skillfully balance the demands of both work and academics to meet essential expenses like tuition, food, and housing. The collective bargaining process holds the potential to tackle several substantial obstacles that may hinder the academic success of student employees. These challenges encompass, but are not limited to, concerns such as insufficient minimum wages, a restrictive 20-hour cap on campus employment, and the absence of provisions for sick leave, holiday pay, or compensation during jury duty.

The unionization efforts by SAs are currently being mediated by the Public Employment Relations Board (PERB). We understand the CSUEU and the CSU have come to an agreement on the eligibility of who is able to vote in the pending election. This is a positive development as there is overwhelming support among the SAs, thousands of whom have signed their union authorization cards to join the CSUEU bargaining units.

We respectfully urge the Chancellor's Office and Board of Trustees to cooperate with PERB and enter into an election agreement with CSUEU for union representation. We understand that CSU can expedite the process, so delaying the process to enter into an election will only harm this invaluable workforce that deserves to be supported.

We look forward to working with CSU and the CSUEU on this groundbreaking effort for SAs to bargain with a collective voice.
