



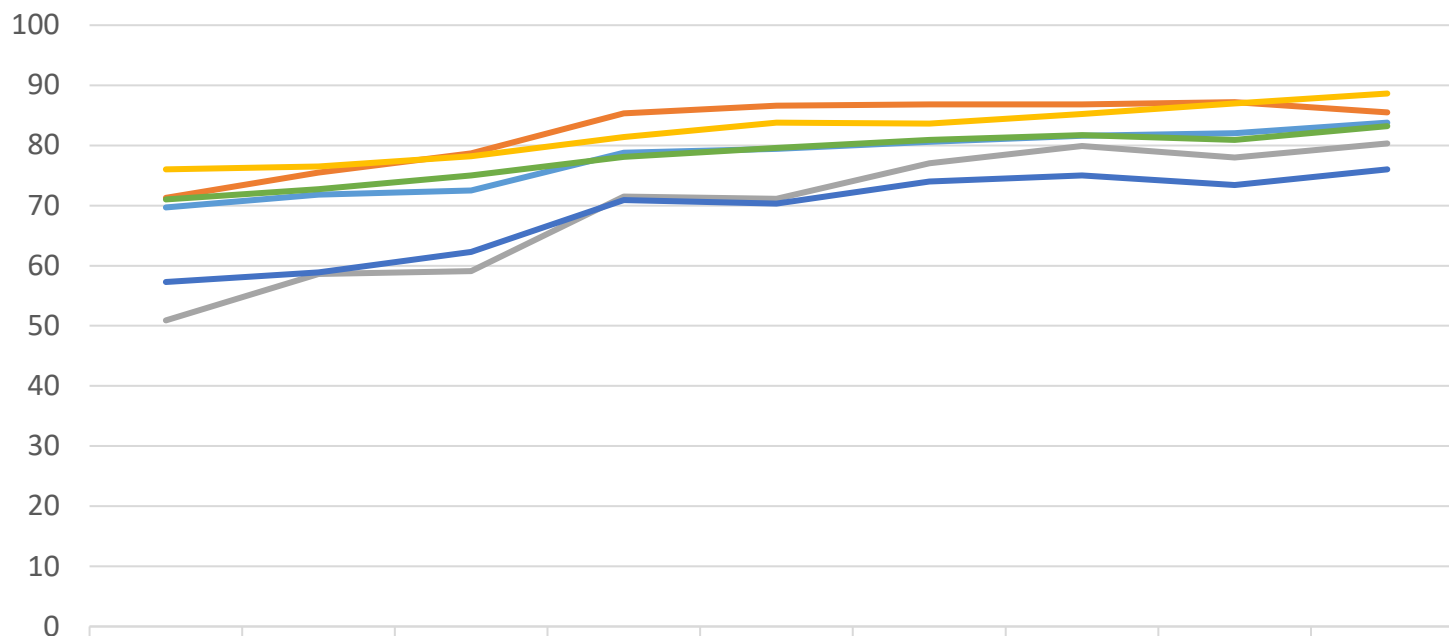

2020 Graduation Rate Highlights

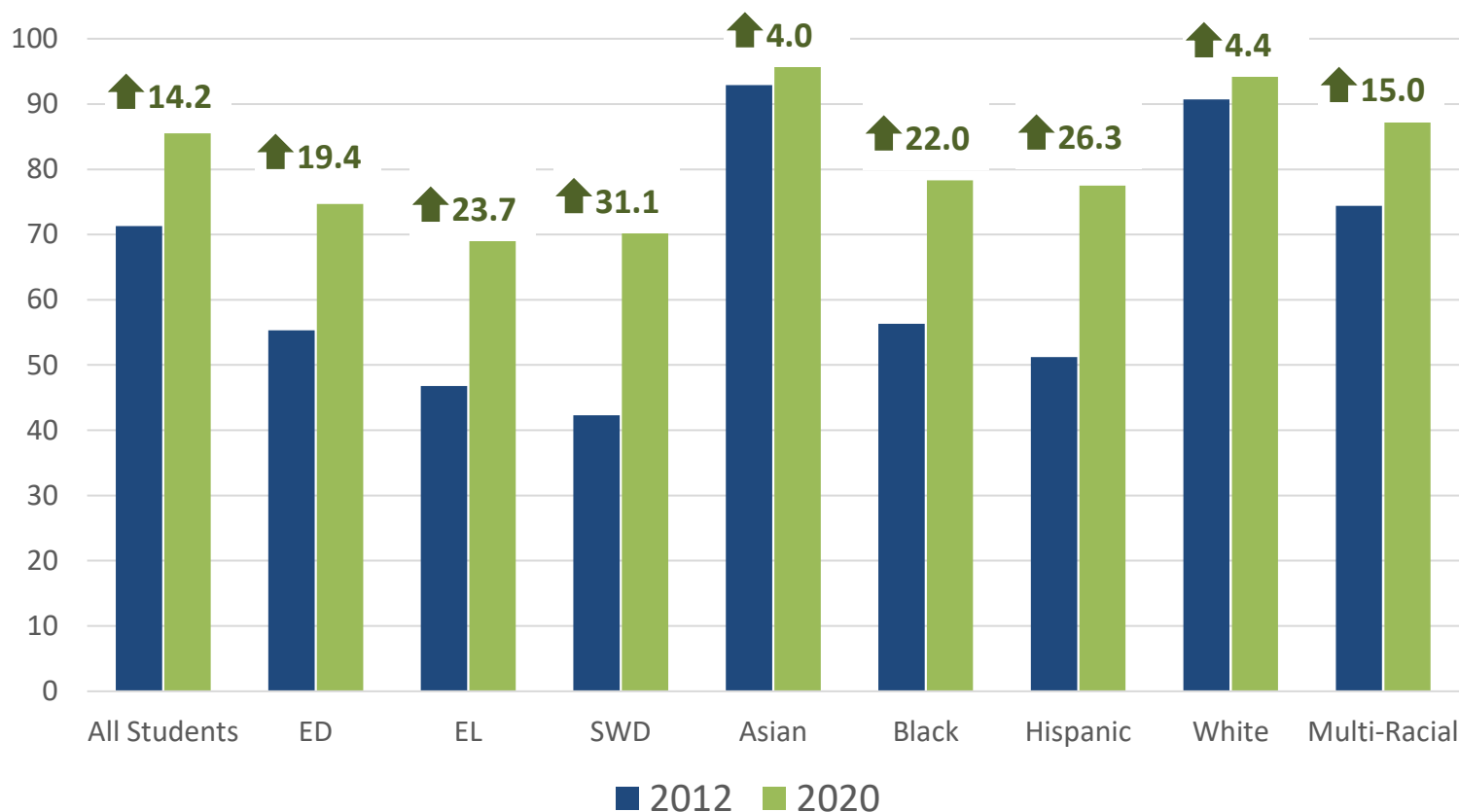
- 2020 graduation rate for Fulton of 85.5 percent was 1.7 percentage points higher than the overall graduation rate for Georgia of 83.8 percent.
- The 2020 graduation rate of 85.5 fell from 2019 rate 87.2
- Graduation rate for Students w/Disabilities increased 2 percentage points from 71.4 percent in 2019 to 73.4 percent in 2020
- Graduation rate for English Learners increased 1.4 percentage points from 69.1 percent in 2019 to 70.5 percent in 2020
- 5-year Graduation rate for Fulton of 89.1 percent which is up from 88.8 percent.

(0.01-point gain since 2018)

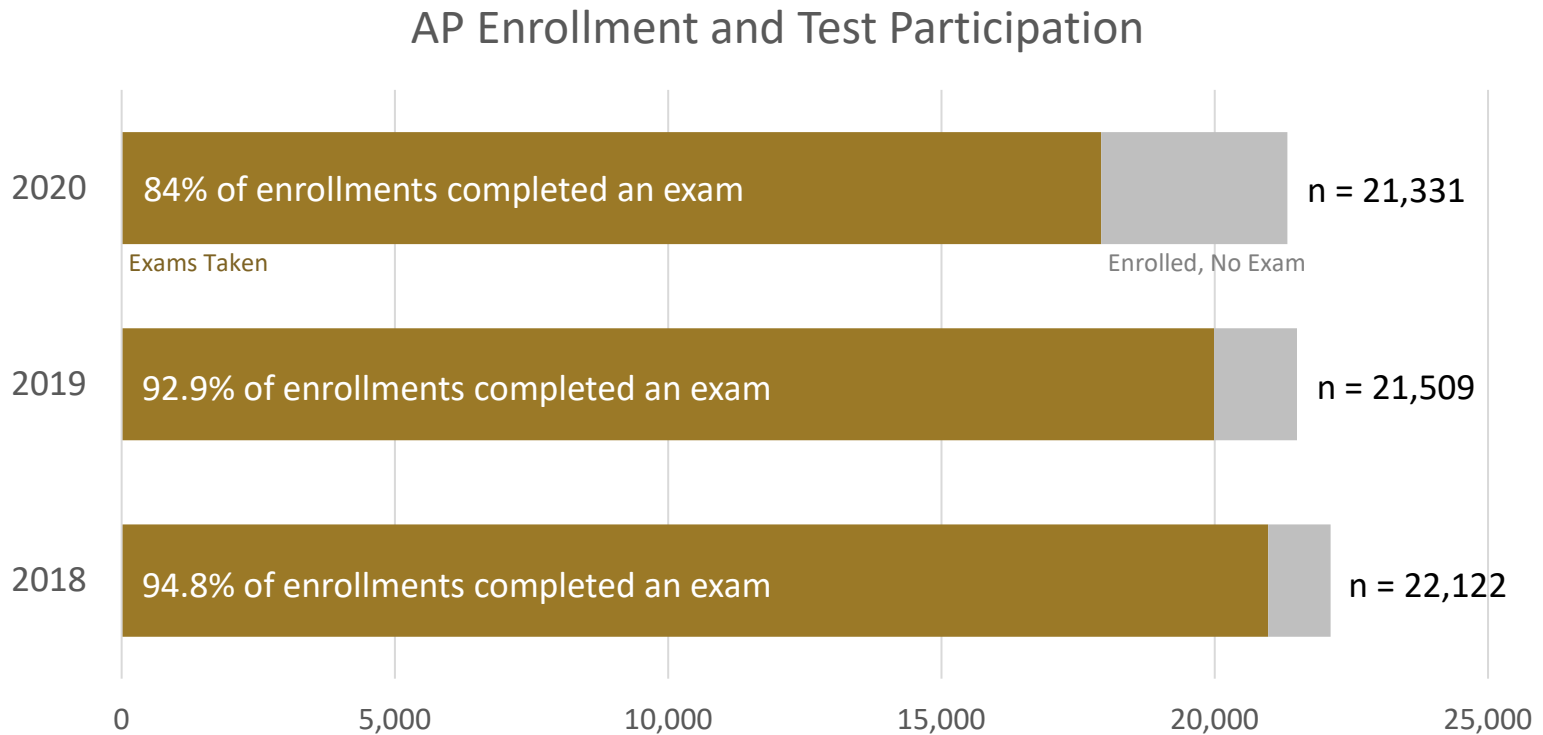
Seven schools have increased their average score since 2018:
