COVID-19 Cases - 10/19/2021

SUMMARY

- As of October 19, 2021, Fulton County has recorded 110,213 confirmed cases and 20,701 probable cases of COVID-19.
- Figure 1 shows both confirmed and probable case counts but the ensuing tables and figures use data from confirmed cases only.
- As of October 19, 2021, Fulton County has recorded **1,584 confirmed COVID-19 deaths**. 160 deaths are currently under review by GA DPH to confirm cause of death.
- By city, new confirmed COVID-19 case rates range from 117.2 per 100,000 persons (Johns Creek) to 262.4 per 100,000 persons (Union City). [Fulton County Diagnoses Rates (per 100,000 persons): Cumulative –10026.8; Incidence 162.2]. See map showing incident case rate by ZIP code on Pg.7.
- Of all PCR testing done in Fulton County between Sept. 27 and Oct. 10, the percent positivity rate was 5.2%.




14-Day Positive Trend Rate per 100,000 Persons

Good News



- 1. The District remains committed to mask optional and is committed to utilizing local data to inform decisions.
- 2. The number of COVID-19 cases appears to have peaked and has been trending downward since early September.
- 3. As a result of community and staff support, there has been a high level of mitigation compliance across the district.
- 4. The District's strategy to intervene at the classroom, grade and school level has minimized learning disruptions across the district.
- 5. The District's modified quarantine protocol has not resulted in a measurable increase in school based COVID-19 cases.
- 6. A significant majority of FCS employees are fully vaccinated, and district employees have been declared eligible for a booster vaccine.



- 1. School leaders are currently able to manage the level of COVID-19 spread within schools without major operational interruptions.
- 2. School-level layered mitigations have helped minimize learning disruptions.
- 3. School-based mitigation practices have allowed extracurriculars to occur with limited disruptions.
- School-level COVID-19 data appears to reflect broader community trends.




Fulton Schools Total Positive Cases (Students and Staff)

- Continue to provide uninterrupted high-quality face-to face instruction for students.
- Attend to the social and emotional needs of students and staff.
- Modify the District's Mitigation Matrix to include local school data when making decisions about masking.
- Continue to encourage FCS employees to become vaccinated.
- Attempt to expand partnerships in effort to provide families with more access to home testing kits.
- Share information relating to a potential post-holiday COVID-19 surge.



Modification to the Mitigation Matrix

- Beginning November 1, 2021, the Superintendent may waive masking for individual schools if the ratio of cases in a school remains less than .01 of enrollment.
- 30 days following the expansion of vaccine eligibility for children 5 and older masks will become optional for students, staff and visitors.
