## **HENRICO COUNTY OVERVIEW**

#### **HENRICO COUNTY**

Total 2020 Population: 334,389

Average Household Size: 2.53

Median Household Income: \$70,307

#### **COMPARISON**

Henrico County's population **increased** by nearly **9%** between 2010-2020 compared to the Richmond MSA's (Metropolitan Statistical Area) increase of 4% during that same time period.

Henrico County's average household size **increased** by nearly **6%** between 2000 and 2019, following both state and national trends.

Henrico County's median household income has remained **steady** since 2000. During this time, Virginia and the Richmond MSA also experienced low growth in median household income.

Henrico County's poverty rate has **decreased** since 2010 to reach **9.1%** in 2019, following similar trends both in the Richmond MSA and Virginia.

In March 2022, Henrico County's unemployment rate was **2.9%** which is slightly **lower** than Virginia's unemployment rate of 3.0%.

The percent of the population in Henrico County with a high school diploma or higher **increased** from 89% in 2010 to **91%** in 2019.

Between 2010 and 2019, the percentage of the population in Henrico County with a bachelor's degree or higher **grew** from 39% in 2010 to **43%** in 2019.


In 2020, Henrico County ranked **94** out of 133 localities in the Fiscal Stress Ranking compared to the City of Richmond's ranking of 25, Chesterfield County's 89, and Hanover County's 120.

The School Composite Index Score indicates the school district's ability to pay education costs fundamental to Virginia's 'Standards of Quality'. Between 2020-2022, Henrico County scored **0.4279**.

Between 2019 and 2020, **44.79%** of Henrico County Public School students were eligible for free or reduced lunch compared to the City of Richmond's 100%, Hanover County's 22.58%, and Chesterfield County's 38.09%.


In 2019, the percentage of Henrico County's population older than 55 years of age was **28%** which aligns with similar percentages in Virginia and the Richmond MSA.

- The total number of housing units in Henrico County **increased** from **130,482** in 2010 to **137,141** in 2019.
- o In 2019, single-family homes represented **65%** of the housing stock in the county with multifamily units representing nearly **35%**.
- The median home value of owned homes in Henrico County **increased** between 2000 and 2019 to reach **\$242,600**.




- The Department of Housing and Urban Development defines cost burdened as households spending more than thirty percent of their income on housing.
- Nearly one in two renters in Henrico
   County is cost burdened compared
   to one in five homeowners who are
   cost burdened.

- Nearly **five** out of ten Henrico County residents identified with a race or ethnic group other than White in 2020.
- The number of Henrico County residents who identified as Black or African American alone increased from 25% in 2000 to 29% in 2020.
- In 2019, 42,000 residents (13%) of Henrico
   County residents were foreign-born or
   were not a US citizen at birth.




Between 2010 and 2019, the Health
 Care and Social Assistance sector
 added 7,097 jobs, the Finance and
 Insurance sector added 5,068 jobs, and
 the Professional, Scientific, and
 Technical Service sector added 4,731
 jobs.



- There are 3,253 acres of parks operated by Henrico County's Division of Recreation and Parks. An additional 667 acres of County-owned land are proposed for future parks.
- In Henrico County, there are 1,393 miles of roads, 267 miles of sidewalks, 42 miles of paved trails, and 14 miles of bike lanes.
- Henrico County has a total of 75 schools and educational facilities which are comprised of 46 Elementary Schools, 12 Middle Schools, 9 High Schools, 3 Advanced Career Education Centers, 4 Alternative Program Centers, and 1 Henrico Virtual Academy.

The HenricoNEXT planning process was initiated in Winter 2021. The diagram below shows the different planning phases and the meetings and deliverables to be expected during each phase.

#### **Fairfield**


- In 2019, the Board of Supervisors approved a 20year lease of the Belmont Golf Course to the First Tee of Greater Richmond
