



FOR STUDENTS: IMPORTANT ITEMS TO REMEMBER ABOUT GETTING AROUND ON CAMPUS.

- **WALK, BIKE, OR USE RAZORBACK TRANSIT** – The University of Arkansas is like a small city, with many of the same logistical concerns. Traffic can become very congested at times, and it becomes more difficult if everyone tries to drive on campus at the same time.
- **BUSES ARE CONVENIENT** – Razorback Transit has extensive routes on campus and throughout Fayetteville, making it easy for you to get to campus or get around on campus, and no one is charged a fare to ride. - **BEGINNING THIS YEAR** – The University of Arkansas is going to a virtual parking permit system in which motorists can purchase an e-permit that is identified by the vehicle license plate. The technology is called license plate recognition (LPR). Virtual parking permits cannot be activated before August 1. - **OUR MOST AFFORDABLE PARKING** – Lot 99 (the commuter lot) is south of the main campus on Beechwood Avenue. Because it isn't close to the heart of campus, it doesn't work for everyone, but parking there costs only **\$26.21** for an entire school year. It is ideal for commuters or for students who do not need their vehicle every day. And because it is supported by Razorback Transit, it's a great park-and-ride option. - **MOST WIDELY USED** – Student parking permits that grant access to green parking areas cost **\$106.89** for the school year; and they're the kind of parking permits used by most students. You may see the green parking areas on the campus parking map: <https://parking.uark.edu/parkmap.pdf>
- **PARKING CLOSER** – Students in residence halls are eligible to try to get a red resident reserved or garage parking permit. Based upon the waiting list prepared by University Housing, Transit and Parking will begin emailing resident reserved offers to students in July. The annual cost for resident reserved parking is **\$692.92**.
- **GARAGE PARKING** – If a resident student does not get a red resident reserved parking permit, he or she may still have an opportunity to secure a garage permit. Employees and resident students get priority for a garage permit before commuting students. The ten-month cost for a garage parking permit is **\$787.10**.
- **PLEASE PARK LEGALLY!** To avoid a parking citation, you will want to take a few minutes to learn where your parking permit grants access on campus. Please pay attention to signs in the parking areas, and do not park in any area that is not clearly marked for parking. Be sure to get reliable information about where to park. (If you hear someone on campus say it is okay to park in a certain location, that does not make it legal). - **BUYING A PARKING PERMIT** – Beginning on Sunday, August 1 you may go online to purchase an orange parking permit for the commuter lot (Lot 99) or a student parking permit for green lots. Simply go to the parking portal at: <https://myparkingaccount.uark.edu>.
