* Instructions for creating your quilt block design *

Please use the page provided to submit your quilt block design on. You may use colored pencils, crayons, markers, etc. to create the picture that represents the beginnings of your state and hopefully its connection to the time of the revolution.

Chapters only, not individuals, are to submit to the contest. Chapters are to submit only one design to their American Heritage State Chair by May 1, 2022.

A winner will be chosen by May 15, 2022, with the winning block sent to national for approval. After approval, the Quilt Project Kit will be sent to your state which will include your material with your state name embroidered at the bottom of your square.

Size: The drawn square on the provided template is the size of your finished quilt block, 8" x 8". At the bottom of the square will be your state name machine embroidered on the cotton. This will leave you with a space of 8" x 6.5" to create your masterpiece.

Technique: Your quilt block design may be pieced and sewn directly to the cotton square, you may applique your design by machine or hand, you may hand embroider your design, or a combination of any of the above. Do not use beads, sequins, or sparkles in your design.

Color: The colors for your quilt block should primarily be Colonial Blue, Gold, and Buff. The Colonial Blue can be found as one of the pantone logo colors on our national website under Member Resources/Logos & Branding/Logo Colors and is the medium light blue in the secondary color palette. The gold is not a metallic color, but rather a flat gold color. Secondary colors can be used, but it should NOT be a patriotic red, white and blue color scheme.
