



About The Gates Scholarship

The Gates Scholarship (TGS) is a highly selective, last-dollar scholarship for outstanding, minority, high school seniors from low-income households. Each year, the scholarship is awarded to exceptional student leaders, with the intent of helping them realize their maximum potential.

Selected Scholars will receive funding for the full cost of attendance to earn a bachelor's degree, that is not already covered by other financial aid and the expected family contribution, as determined by the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), or the methodology used by a Scholar's college or university. Costs covered include tuition, fees, books, room and board, and may include additional personal costs.

TGS also provides Scholars with various online support services designed to help them excel in their degree programs, graduate, and make a successful transition to their chosen careers. These include career services, mentoring, leadership development, wellness, and knowledge building.

Eligibility Requirements

To apply, a student must be:

- A high school senior
- From at least one of the following ethnicities: African American, American Indian/Alaska Native*, Asian/Pacific Islander American, and/or Hispanic American
- Pell-eligible
- A US citizen, national, or permanent resident
- In good academic standing with a minimum cumulative weighted GPA of 3.3 on a 4.0 scale (or equivalent)

Additionally, a student must plan to enroll full-time, in a four-year degree program, at a US accredited, not-for-profit, private or public college or university.

**For American Indian/Alaska Native, proof of tribal enrollment will be required.*

Ideal Candidate

An ideal candidate will have:

- An outstanding academic record in high school (in the top 10% of his/her graduating class)
- Demonstrated leadership ability (e.g., as shown through participation in community service, extracurricular, or other activities)
- Exceptional personal success skills (e.g., emotional maturity, motivation, perseverance, etc.)

Timeline

Online applications open July 15, 2023. The scholarship cohort will be selected in April 2024, with awards disbursed in the fall.

- July 15, 2023 Application, Phase I opens.
- September 15, 2023 Deadline for Application, Phase I.
- December 1, 2023 Semi-finalists announced.
- December 1, 2023 Application, Phase II opens (Semi-finalists only).
- January 15, 2024 Deadline for Application, Phase II.
- March 1, 2024 Finalists announced.
- March 2024 Finalists interviewed.
- April 20, 2024 Cohort of Scholars announced.
- Fall 2024 Financial awards are disbursed.

Funding

Selected Scholars will receive funding for the full cost of attendance that is not already covered by other financial aid and the expected family contribution, as determined by the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), or the methodology used by a Scholar's college or university.

**Cost of attendance includes tuition, fees, room, board, books, and transportation, and may include other personal costs.*
