The amount of illegal and unregulated gambling has been on an unprecedented growth spurt for the past four years. In some jurisdictions, its size rivals regulated gaming. While some forms of this gambling are apparent, others operate in the shadows created by old, outdated laws about gambling, raffles, sweepstakes, and giveaway contests. Other gambling escapes regulation under the veil of "skill." This panel will discuss how technology is being used by Ubermotivated operators to avoid regulation, taxes, responsible gaming, and an array of consumer protections. It will illuminate the scope and breadth of these offerings and discuss solutions to prevent the complete erosion of public policy for gaming activities.
