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The Coolidge Scholarship for Juniors

[Coolidge Scholarship](#) - now open for current Juniors

The Coolidge Scholarship is a full-ride, four-year, merit scholarship that may be used by recipients for undergraduate study at any accredited college or university in the United States. Any high school **junior** who plans to enroll in college in the fall of 2024 and is an American citizen or legal permanent resident is eligible to apply (current high school seniors are not eligible to apply). Winners may use the scholarship to pursue any academic major.

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AP EXAM REGISTRATION – still available through March 1st

Students can still register for AP exams; however, the Late Fee is now in effect.

1. **Students planning to self-study for an exam**, must also JOIN with a self-study code & PAY. Email Mrs. Mertel for the self-study code.
2. **JOIN** using your College Board MyAP username and password. Log into *AP Classroom* to join a course or take an exam. Instructions can be found at College Board AP ([here](#)). <https://bit.ly/JOINAPCLASSESECTION> Students must register with the appropriate Join Code for each exam they wish to take. Mrs. Mertel can supply the correct codes.

2023 AP EXAM FEES

- Standard Fee is now \$145
- Reduced Fee (plus Late Fee) will be applied on all exams for students enrolled in the *Federal Student Lunch Program* (see counselor). - \$45/exam
- Late Registration Fee is now effective:
 - After November 1st for first semester and full-year courses
 - After March 1st for second semester courses

- Cancel Fee is \$50 per exam and is applied as follows:
 - After November 1st for first semester and full-year courses
 - After March 1st for second semester courses

➤ Hackathon by the Sea 2023 – January 6 & 7

VCOE is proud to announce its annual Hackathon by The Sea on **January 6-7, 2023**. We are excited to offer this **in-person, overnight** event to **high school** students. Technologists from VCOE, Hacker Fund, the Navy, and many of our industry partners will be hosting workshops that will expose your students to the skills and concepts they need to be competitive in emerging job markets related to CTE industry pathways.

As a preview of the hackathon, **here are some outcomes** you can expect for your students:

➤ **Stevens Institute of Technology PAID virtual summer research program:**

The School of Business at Stevens Institute of Technology is offering a paid virtual summer research program for high school students. In this six-week program, students will have the opportunity to work alongside a faculty member from the School of Business and assist them with research in their area of study such as management, leadership, or finance. The final assignment will include a PowerPoint presentation detailing their research findings. The program will run from July 1, 2023, through August 12, 2023, and students will receive a \$500 stipend after completing the program. The attached flyer can be uploaded on your school's website.

Eligibility: Applicants must currently be in their junior year of high school (no exceptions).

Deadline: Applications are due by March 1, 2023.

Notification: Applicants will be notified by April 1, 2023.

The application packet will include all the following:

- 1-page essay in which you describe yourself and detail what you hope to gain from this experience
- a copy of your current resume
- a copy of your unofficial high school transcript
- one letter of recommendation from a teacher, a guidance counselor, or a work supervisor. *These letters can also be emailed directly to Lindsay Hartelius at lharteli@stevens.edu.*

➤ **USC Bovard Scholars for Students with financial need – application open now**

- Junior in high school (11th grader) at time of application
- Currently hold a 4.0 GPA or above
- Enrolled in Algebra II, Trigonometry or above

If selected, each Bovard Scholar will have one full year of support through the admissions cycle and spend three weeks on the USC campus, where they will receive:

As many of you begin applying to college, we want you to know about a new, free, open online resource! [The AXS Companion](#) will help guide you and answer your questions as you apply to college using [Common App](#). The AXS Companion and Common App can be used side-by-side on a phone, tablet, or laptop!



- **Standout Admissions Network (formerly Coalition Application)**: A different application platform similar to the Common Application with over 150 college/university members. Essay prompt is available online.

- **University of California application:** Application opens August 1. ***Submission of completed applications is October 1-November 30.***

UC's do NOT need recommendation letters. SAT/ACT test scores will not be required.

UC's will be reviewing all applicants holistically for Fall 2023 class.

- **California State University application:** Application opened **October 1st**. ***Deadline for submission of completed application is November 30.***

CSU's do NOT need recommendation letters. SAT/ACT test scores will be OPTIONAL and will be used for college level math & English course placement only.

Application fee is \$70/campus. <https://www2.calstate.edu/>

- **ACT/SAT Testing:** Many colleges are still TEST OPTIONAL for Fall 2023. There may be exceptions for athletes or home-schooled students. Make sure to check the colleges on your list to verify their policy for admissions.

Students may select on the Common Application whether they want test scores included or not in their review. If required, colleges/universities will accept either ACT or SAT for admissions. The last date accepted for most college applications is the December test date. Try to allow taking the test 2-3 times, if possible. Colleges will always take the best score & some even Superscore and take the best composite subject scores from different test dates.

Should I submit my scores or not? This is a common question posed by many students & is ultimately a personal decision. In general, if a student “feels good” about their score and did “better than the college's published average”, then submit it.

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WHS: A SPARTAN SELECT SCHOOL AT MICHIGAN STATE UNIVERSITY

Consider adding Michigan State University to your college list!

Westlake High School has been designated as a SPARTAN Select school. What does this mean?

This Spartan Select designation is only for selected schools in CA. All Westlake High School students admitted to Michigan State will be eligible to receive a **4-year renewable grant up to \$15,000**.

Students will also receive a one-time study abroad award of \$3,000 to \$5,000, and if eligible, students can receive additional legacy and/or honors college awards. Students will see this new award reflected in their packages within 10 business days. Please note this award may replace some other MSU awards that have already been offered. This is MERIT scholarship awarded regardless of income!!!

The following potential academic awards are available, if eligible:

- \$15,000 scholarship to admitted students. (Reducing the \$50,149 cost for tuition, room, and board to \$35,149)
- An additional \$1,250 award per year to alumni dependents
- One-time study abroad scholarship of \$3,000 to \$5,000.
- Additional scholarships for honors students
- In-state tuition for military dependents. (Room, board, and tuition approximately \$26,000. NO OTHER above awards apply.)

SCHOLARSHIPS & GRANTS ARE FREE MONEY THAT DO NOT NEED TO BE REPAYED.

CAUTION: YOU SHOULD NEVER PAY TO RECEIVE SCHOLARSHIPS.

Scholarships usually require applications & some form of essay/personal statement. Some scholarships are based on merit/achievements, and some are based on financial need. **There are many reputable websites that can help you find scholarships (Fast Web, Cappex, Scholarships.com, Sallie Mae, etc.) Your Naviance account includes many local scholarships (Naviance/Colleges/Scholarship & Money).**

It is not too early for seniors to be thinking of scholarship opportunities to help pay for college. Many of the large Foundation scholarships occur from October-December (Coca-Cola, Elks, Ventura County Community Foundation, etc.). Local scholarships generally occur in the spring from January-May (Westlake Fan Club Foundation, Rotary, Westlake Women's Club, etc.).

As you complete your applications for admission, make sure that you research & apply for university-specific scholarships for which you may be eligible (BEFORE you are accepted!). You don't have to be accepted to apply at many schools.

This is NOT a complete listing. Make sure you check Naviance or other scholarship site.

The Edison Scholars Program recognizes students who plan to pursue a college degree in science, technology, engineering, or math (STEM).

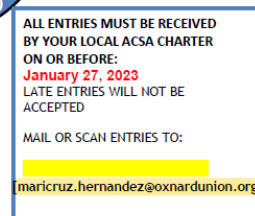
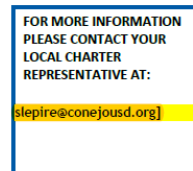
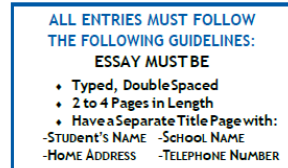

How it works: If a student applies to a member college & is accepted, their financial aid letter will include their micro-scholarship. Colleges may have school-specific requirements for use of the micro-scholarships: Some colleges allow their use for specific-majors only, etc. Students should check with the colleges when they apply, to verify the college-specific criteria.

- **Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE)** is an agreement among WICHE's 16 member states and territories, through which 160+ participating public colleges and universities provide steep nonresident tuition savings for Western students. Through WUE, eligible students can choose from hundreds of undergraduate programs outside their home state and pay no more than 150 percent of that institution's resident tuition rate. Since full nonresident college-tuition rates may exceed 300 percent of resident rates, WUE increases affordable higher-education choices for students, and minimizes the adverse impacts of student loan debt. Financial aid eligibility is based on a student's financial need, which is the difference between the college's Cost of Attendance (COA) and the student's Expected Family Contribution (EFC).

- The COA is based on tuition, fees, room, board, books, supplies, equipment, transportation to/from college and miscellaneous expenses.
- The EFC is based on the student and parent income and assets, family size, number of children in college and other demographic factors.

This *federal* EFC is calculated based on the information reported on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Most colleges use the federal EFC for awarding their own financial aid funds in addition to government aid. Fewer than 200 colleges use a supplemental form called the CSS PROFILE to calculate an *institutional* EFC. These "PROFILE" colleges still use the federal EFC for awarding federal and state aid.

This calculator lets you estimate your child's EFC before you complete the FAFSA by answering a subset of the questions on the FAFSA. In most cases, a student with a lower EFC or higher COA will qualify for more financial aid. You can use the calculator to evaluate the impact of changes in income and assets on eligibility for need-based financial aid.

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ACT & SAT INFORMATION & TEST PREPARATION

Many schools are extending test-optional policies for the Fall 2023 college applicants. Students should check the admission requirements for the schools to which they apply.

Should I submit my scores or not? This is a common question posed by many students & is ultimately a personal decision. In general, if a student “feels good” about their score and did “better than” the specific college average score, then submit it.

What is an average score? Check the college website to see the average test score for their admitted students.

- 2) Download the blank work permit request from the CCC/Jobs website.
