- Coordinate an off-site roundtable with various businesses for leaders to express their concerns at an open forum
- In Carnegie, PA, House Republicans met with local small business owners facing Democrats' job-killing policies. The meeting was followed by a tour of the steel services facility that hosted the group, and concluded with a media availability



3 Go to the Source

- Whether it's an oil producer or a gas station, go to a location where you'll be able to get the facts on the rising gas prices that Americans are facing
- Speak directly with constituents at these locations about the sacrifices they've had to make in light of skyrocketing prices
- At Shell's Appomattox offshore oil platform, House Republicans learned firsthand how the Appomattox platform produces approximately 140,000 barrels of oil each day and how Shell invests billions of dollars in the Gulf of Mexico each year to safely supply the United States with oil and natural gas
