



Industry growth in Southwestern Oregon is projected to be slower than statewide, particularly in information and professional and business services. Only one major industry (financial activities) is projected to decline.


Keep in mind that even in slow growth or declining industries there will still be many job openings due to replacement, which make up the vast majority of vacancies in all industries.

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

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
