

Skin of Color Clerkship

All visiting medical students who are interested in Skin of Color dermatology are encouraged to apply to the clerkship. This 4-week program will provide mentorship, networking opportunities, and stipend support (up to \$1,500) to **two** fourth-year medical students. Preference will be given to applicants who have been disadvantaged because of economic hardship, educational disadvantage, and/or other social/personal struggle.

Please indicate your interest in the Skin of Color Clerkship by completing and uploading the supplemental application to the Visiting Student Learning Opportunities (VSLO) along with other UTSW Visiting Medical Student Application Requirements.

We will accept applications for the Skin of Color Clerkship until April 20th, 2023. Applicants selected to participate in the Skin of Color Clerkship will be notified by the first week of May.

Application Process

- Review the UTSW Visiting Medical Student Application Requirements
- Apply for your chosen elective in VSLO at aamc.org/vslo.
- Complete the supplemental application for the Skin of Color Clerkship
- The application includes a Letter of Intent (1 page maximum) which should-
 1. Explain your personal experiences/motivations that led to your interest in Skin of Color dermatology and how the Skin of Color Clerkship will support or align with your future goals.
 2. Explain why you believe you should be considered a disadvantaged applicant
